Show Rules and Regulations

1. Disclaimer of Liability

Neither the Society nor any of its officers or servants will be responsible for anything that may happen to exhibitors, their servants or any other person, or their respective property or animals, or to any exhibit at the show, and it shall be considered a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the Society blameless and that he/she shall be considered to indemnify the Society against any legal proceedings, claims or demands in respect thereof. Exhibitors adknowledge that they are taking part in a risk sport and agreed to having achieved a level of competency. In addition, they agree that they understand it is their responsibility to insure their property, animals and livestock (this includes infected animals) whilst on the Showground and hold full public liability insurance.

All competitors must have current public liability/third-party insurance cover. Please ensure you carry relevant documents with you as Stewards may require to see evidence.

- 2. Dogs must be on a short lead at all times whilst on the Showground..
- 3. To be eligible to make entries at Members rates an exhibitor must have paid their annual subscription by 1st April of the current year.
- 4. The Society will not be responsible for any error in the schedule or programme or for any entry being made in the wrong class.
- 5. In all classes the Society reserves the right to accept or reject the entry of any person and also the right to withdraw any prizes awarded.
- 6. The Society reserve the right to cancel or amalgamate a class if, in their opinion, there are insufficient entries.
- 7. No refunds will be made but substitution will be allowed in the horse classes by an animal belonging to the same owner. The Secretary must be notified not less than one hour before the class is due to commence.
- 8. Prize money will not be awarded if, in the opinion of the judges, there is insufficient merit.
- 9. A judge's decision shall be final. Any competitor intending to object must notify the Secretary in writing, together with a deposit of £50, returnable if the objection is upheld.
- 11. All cups must be returned to the Society by 15th July of the year following the award.
- 12. Valid passports must be held for all equines competing at the Show. Passports and vaccination records must be available for inspection and produced on request.
- 13. Any horse or pony competing at the Show will be liable to dope testing.
- 14. Riders must have attained their 3rd birthday in all ridden classes.
- 15. Correct riding attire must be worn and correctly secured. British Standard skull caps/riding hats to PA 015 2011 with BSI kitemark, VG1 with BSI kitemark, Snell 2016 onwards with the official Snell label, ASTIM -F1163 2004a onwards with SEI mark, AS/NXS 3838, 2006 onwards must be worn at all times when mounted and by handlers aged 14 years and under in In Hand classes. Riders in BSPS classes will be required to comply with Rule 43 in the 2023 BSPS Rulebook
- 16. Personal Data: All exhibitors will need to provide the Breed Societies with certain personal information relating to you. Your privacy is extremely important, for further information on how the Societies will use that personal information please refer to the relevant Breed Society websites.
- 17. The Alresford and District Agricultural Society recommends that all horses are vaccinated against Equine Flu.

Trophies cannot be collected before 1.00pm except in exceptional circumstances.

MAIN RING

Classes 1- 6, 101-104 are direct qualifiers for the finals of the BHSA Rising Star Classes at London International Horse Show

Available to amateur members and non-members, please see Rule 7 in 2023 BSHA Rulebook.

Open to horses which have never been placed in the top 9 in any class at a HOYS Final (not including SFAS, but to include the top three placings in the SEIB R2R Final); and riders not to have competed at HOYS in the current season and the two years prior to the current season (not including SFAS)

Open to horses which have never been placed in the top 9 in any RIHS BSHA Open Final at Hickstead.

Competitors do not have to be members to compete in the direct qualifiers, however all competitors who receive their qualification to the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Supreme Final must complete their membership and registration with the BSHA within 7 days for their qualification to stand or this will pass down the line.

No competitor previously deemed a Showing Professional/Producer, may be permitted to enter these classes.

JMB certificates will not be required to compete in these classes.

The judge will NOT ride exhibits in these classes.

CLASS 1Rising Star Racehorse to Show Horse: Mare or gelding, 4 years old or over,
exceeding 148cm. Open to thoroughbred horses
retired from race training. The winner of the class will qualify for the LIHS BSHA
Rising Star Racehorse to Show Horse
Supreme Final at the LIHS in December. If already qualified the qualification will
move down to no lower than third place.
Semi-final places will be awarded to second and third place unless already qualified.
This class is open to competitors who work within the racing industry.
The Cross PCC awarded to the winner

CLASS 2 Rising Star of Ridden Hunter type Small/Lightweight Hunter: Mare or gelding, 4 years old or over exceeding 158cms, (small hunter not to exceed exceeding 158cms). Capable of carrying up to 79.5kgs (12 stone 7lbs). The highest placed Small and the highest placed Lightweight will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Small/Lightweight Hunter Supreme Final at the LIHS in December. If already qualified the qualification will move down to no lower than third place. Semi-final places will be awarded to second and third place unless already qualified.

The Walden Salver PCC to the winner.

The HH Supporters Club PCC for the highest placed local hunter, horse/rider living within a radius of 12 miles of the showground. Those eligible to wear **WHITE** armbands – see map on page 15

CLASS 3 Rising Type of Ridden Hunter Type. Middleweight/Heavyweight Hunter: Mare or gelding, 4 years old or over, exceeding 158cms. Capable of carrying over 89kgs (14 stone). The highest placed Middleweight and highest placed Heavyweight will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Middleweight/Heavyweight Hunter Supreme Final at the LIHS in December. If already qualified the qualification will move down to no lower than third place. Semi-final places will be awarded to second and third place unless already qualified.

The Parsons PCC to the winner.

The South Down Bloodhounds PCC to the highest placed local hunter, horse/rider living within a radius of 12 miles of the showground. Those eligible to wear WHITE armbands – see map on page 15

CLASS 4 Rising Star of Working Hunter type: Mare, gelding or stallion (competing stallions must have a red, white and blue ribbon

displayed in their tail), 4 years old and over exceeding 148cm (14.2hh approx.) Any horse which is registered / previously

registered as a Grade A showjumper, Advanced Eventer, or above as at 1st January of the current year, is not eligible.

Height of fences: minimum 3'0", maximum 3'3", maximum spread 3'3". Please note the height of the fences may be raised

at the final at the discretion of the Course builder/ BSHA Representative.

The winner of the class will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Working Hunter Type Supreme Final at the LIHS in

December. If already qualified the qualification will move down to no lower than third place. Semi-final places will be awarded

to second and third place unless already qualified

The Nita Garry PCC to the winner.

The Catherston Thunderstorm PCC to the highest placed hunter 158cm or under. Those eligible to wear **RED** armbands - see map on page 15.

HUNTER CHAMPIONSHIP (MR). 1st & 2nd prize winners from classes 2 - 4. **The John Gray PCC** to the winner.

BEST SHOD. A competition sponsored by the Worshipful Company of Farriers, for the best shod horse in the hunter section, classes 2, 3 & 4. The judge will examine each horse before or during the line-up for preliminary judging, taking into consideration the following:

a) condition of the feet

b) the making (or preparation) of the shoes

c) the Nailing and position of the clips

Normal shoes and showing plates are equally acceptable, providing, they are suitable for the horse.

The Worshipful Company of Farriers will award:

- A rosette and an inscribed card to the winner of each class
- A brass plaque to the overall winner
- A brass plaque to the Registered Farrier for its feet and shoeing

CLASS 5 Rising Star Working Show Horse: Mare, gelding or stallion (competing stallions must have a red, white and blue ribbon displayed in their tail), 4 years old and over exceeding 148cm (14.2hh approx.) Any horse which is Grade B showjumper, Intermediate Eventer, or above as at 1st January of the current year, is not eligible. Height of fences: minimum 2'6", maximum 2'9", maximum spread 2'9". Please note the height of the fences may be raised at the final at the discretion of the Course builder/ BSHA Representative. The winner of the class will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Working Show Horse Supreme Final at the LIHS in December. If already qualified the qualification will move down to no lower than third place. Semi-final places will be awarded to second and third place unless already qualified CLASS 6 Rising Star Ladies Show Horse: Mare or gelding, 4 years old or over, exceeding 148cms, suitable to carry a side saddle, to be

ridden by a lady. Open to all Hacks, Cobs, Riding Horses and Hunters. The winner of the class will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Ladies Show Horse Supreme Final at the LIHS in December. If already qualified the gualification will move down

to no lower than third place. Semi- final places will be awarded to second and third place unless already qualified.

The Begg PCC awarded to the winner

CLASS 7 Side Saddle Concours D'Elegance Costume Class. The sole criterion for this class is the elegance of the picture presented by horse/pony and rider, and the way of going of the horse/pony. Safe tack must be used. Detailed inspection of the rider's period costume is not required. Fancy dress is not permitted. Competitors are required to walk, trot and canter. No individual show is required, but the judge may ask a small group of 3 or 4 riders to give a short display. A special rosette will be awarded to the highest placed adult and junior Members of the SSA. Competitors are requested to provide details of their costume for the Commentator. The Basil Samuel PCC to the winner.

The winner of the class will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Maxi Cob Supreme Final at the LIHS in December. If already qualified the qualification will move down to no lower than third place. Semi-final places will be awarded to second and third place unless already qualified.

CLASS 103 Rising Star of Riding Horse type

Small Riding Horse: Mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, exceeding 148cms and not exceeding 158cms. Large Riding Horse – exceeding 158cms. The highest placed Small and the highest placed Large will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Supreme Small & Large Riding Horse Supreme Final respectively at the LIHS in December. The next two highest placed unqualified exhibits will qualify for the BSHA qualifier (semi-final) at Addington Equestrian Centre on Sunday 10th September. **The Dick Corbett PCC** to the winner

CLASS 104 Rising Star of Hack Type

Rising Star of Hack Type Small and Large Hack: Mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, exceeding 148cms, but not exceeding 160cms. The winner of the class will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Hack Supreme Final at the LIHS in December. If already qualified the qualification will move down to no lower than third place. Semi-final places will be awarded to second and third place unless already qualified.

Championship for the 1st and 2nd prizewinners in Classes 101-104 The Denis Blanchard PCC awarded to the Champion.

Mare or gelding 4 yrs old and over. Mountain and Moorland registered ponies not exceeding 128cms. Ridden by a child to have attained their 5th birthday on the 1st January in the current year and not to attain their 10th birthday in the current year. Any suitable snaffle bridle. Leaders must be 16 years old or over and may only lead one pony in a class. There will be obstacles including three small upright fences not exceeding 30cms. The winner qualifies for the LIHS.

CLASS 202 BSPS OPEN CRADLE STAKES

Mare or gelding, 4 years old or over, not exceeding 122cms. Suitable to be ridden a rider not to have attained their 11th birthday before 1st January in the current year. The winner qualifies for the LIHS.

CLASS 203 BSPS OPEN NURSERY STAKES

Mare or gelding, 4 years old or over not exceeding 133cms. Suitable to be ridden by a rider not to have attained their 13th birthday before 1st January in the current year. The winner qualifies for the LIHS.

CLASS 204 NOVICE WORKING HUNTER PONY

Ponies 4years and over not exceeding 153cm. Riders any age. Ponies under 133cm, height of fences: 60cm. Ponies under 153cm, height of fences: 75cm. Open to any breed not to have won a prize in any ridden hunter class valued £10 or more - turnout to type.

CLASS 205 OPEN WORKING HUNTER PONY

Ponies 4years and over not exceeding 153cm. Riders any age. Ponies under 133cm, heights of fences: 70cm. Ponies under 153cm, height of fences: 85cm. Open to any breed - turnout to type.

Working Hunter Pony Championship. 1st & 2nd prize winners from classes 201-205 The Tilling PCC to the winner

- CLASS 206 Best Hunting Pony. Mare or gelding, 4years old and over, not exceeding 153cms. Riders 16years and under. Brief individual show to incorporate a small fence. The Skeggs PCC awarded to the winner.

The NPS/Nicholls Family Ridden Silver Medal Rosette is offered by the NPS for the best registered pony owned by a BPS qualifying or Life Member in the M&M ridden section excluding Leading Rein & First Ridden. Membership cards MUST BE presented in the ring to receive the medal and/or the qualification.

The BSPS Performance Coloured Classes are open to stallions, mares and geldings 4 years old and over to be registered in and complying with the showing requirements of the main body of the stud book of the Coloured Horse and Pony Society CHAPS (UK) or the British Skewbald and Piebald Association (BSPA). Ponies can be registered with either of these Societies or the BSPS and owners and riders must be or become members within 7 days of the BSPS to take the qualification.

CLASS 313 The NPS/Mole Valley Farmers Small Breed M & M (MIM-HPIH)Home Produced in Hand National Championship. Stallions, mares or geldings any age. Please see NPS Rule Book, Sec A, 3.6.

Please enter this class in the spirit it is intended. Competitors who contravene the above will be disqualified.

- CLASS 314 The NPS/Mole Valley Farmers Large Breed M & M (MIM-HPIH) Home Produced in Hand National Championship. Stallions, mares or geldings any age. Please see NPS Rule Book, Sec A, 3.6. Please enter this class in the spirit it is intended. Competitors who contravene the above will be disqualified.
- CLASS 315 The NPS/Niart Stud M&M (MIN-IH) Small Breeds Championship. Stallions, mares or geldings 4 years or over. These classes are open to pure bred registered M&M ponies in the main body of their studbook. Owner's membership cards must be shown in the ring to receive qualifications. Foals are not eligible to qualify.

The Kingsmead Evita PCC to the highest placed Welsh Section A or B.

CLASS 316 The NPS/Niart Stud M & M (MIN-IH) Large Breeds Championship. Stallions, mares or geldings 4 years or over. These classes are open to pure bred registered M & M ponies in the main body of their studbook. Owner's membership cards must be shown in the ring to receive qualifications. Foals are not eligible to qualify.

> The Wheelydown Sonnet Memorial Salver for the best New Forest. The Kentchurch PCC to the highest placed Welsh Section C or D.

The M & M in Hand Championship. 1st and 2nd prize winners from classes 311 to 316. The Egerton PCC to the winner.

SILVER MEDAL ROSETTE CHAMPIONSHIPS. These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. NPS Silver Medal Rosettes are only awarded when the owner of the champion pony is a Qualifying or Life member of the NPS. A valid membership card must be in the rider's/handler's possession on entering the ring and be produced immediately on request by either the judge or the steward. If the owner of the Champion pony is not a member, or the owner's membership card is not immediately produced, the rosette may be awarded to the Reserve Champion provided they have the required membership card. If the Champion pony has previously qualified it is still entitled to the Silver Medal Rosette, but the qualification card goes to the Reserve Champion pony, provided the owner of that pony is a member of the NPS. The Silver Medal Rosette and the qualification card can be awarded no lower than first Reserve (third). Foals are not eligible for Silver Medal Championships. Qualifiers are entitled to compete in the final of the Silver Medal Rosette Championship to be held at the NPS Summer Championship Show in August 2024.

NPS/BLACKERTOR & SHARPTOR STUDS M&M In Hand Silver Medal Rosette Championship (SM-MMIH) A Silver Medal Rosette is offered by the National Pony Society for the best registered pony owned by an NPS Qualifying or Life member in the M&M In Hand section. Membership cards must be presented in the ring to receive the medal and/or the qualification. NPS M&M Breed Champions. A pony may only qualify for the Silver Medal Final once in a season. NPS M&M Breed Champion Prelim Rounds Qualifier for the Great British In Hand Show 2024 Oakridge Arena. NPS Qualifying Rounds: These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. Ponies must be registered in any of the British Riding Pony studbook sections or the Ridden Register; the GSB; the AHSB; the AASB or registered in the main body of their respective M&M Stud Book. Part breds are not eligible unless over stamped into one of the British Riding Pony studbook sections. or the Ridden Register. Qualifying rounds for most NPS competitions are open to ponies owned by NPS members and non-members but only ponies owned by adult NPS Qualifying or Life members are eligible to qualify for the final of the competition at the NPS Summer Championship Show at Malvern from August 2024. The highest placed pony, if owned by an NPS member, in each class will qualify for the final. Qualification may pass down to third place if the first and second ponies are already qualified. NPS/Corscaron Horse Essentials Home Produced Ridden Championship - Riders of Home-Produced ponies (see definition in the NPS Rules Book) can wear a white arm band in classes where this is indicated. These ponies, if owned by NPS members, are then eligible to qualify for the final at the NPS Summer Championship Show. The Owner's Membership cards MUST be produced in the ring when requested or the qualification will be forfeit.
